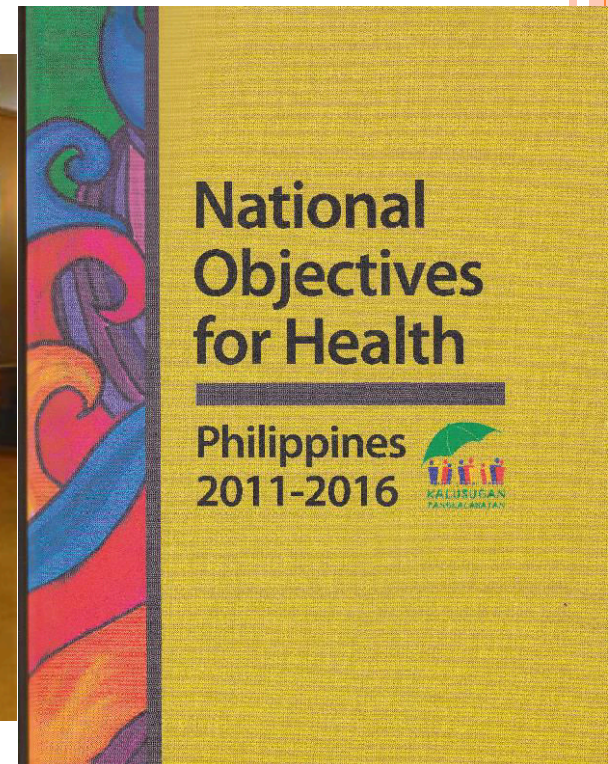

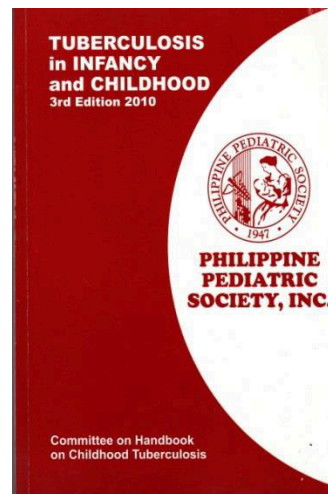

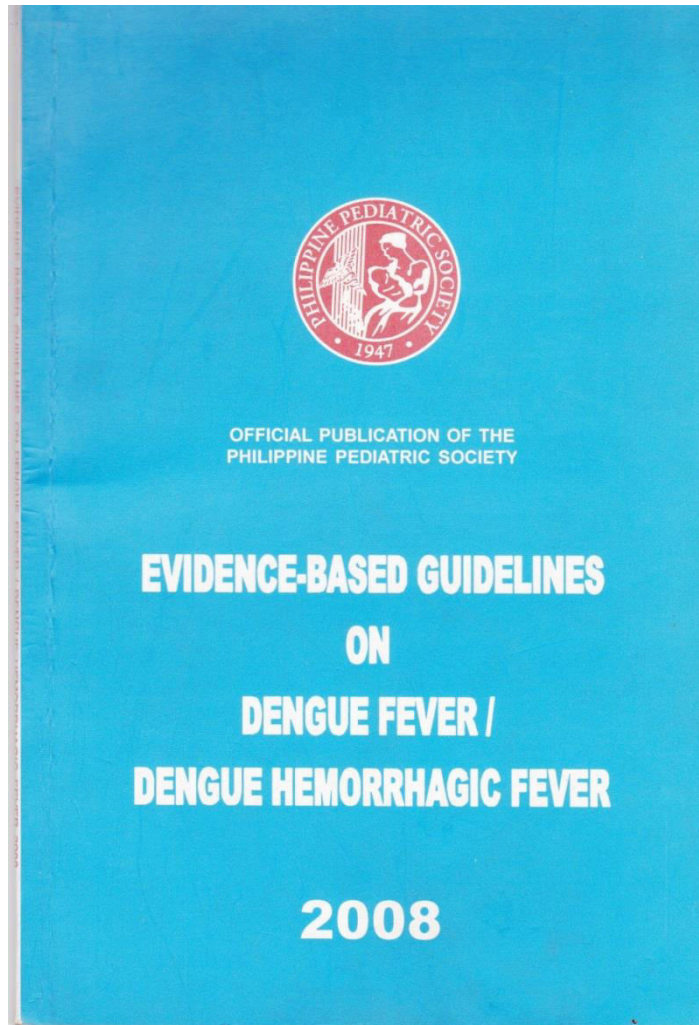

VPD EXPERT REVIEW COMMITTEE:

- 1. Reviews all case investigation reports and other records of AFP, measles compatible & NT**
- 2. Meets once every quarter**
- 3. Compiles and analyzes info from DOH to monitor progress towards polio eradication, measles and NT elimination**
- 4. Provides recommendation and guidance to DOH**
- 5. Participates in field visits when needed**
- 6. Participates in advocacy activities**
- 7. Submits a quarterly reports of their findings, recommended strategies and potential solutions**
- 8. The measles and NT ERC shall supervise and guide the annual verification documentation process at the country level**
- 9. The measles and NT ERC shall monitor progress towards accelerated rubella control and CRS prevention**
